- Side rolls have been on this horse since the first day of training. It keeps him focused on his work.
- 2. A regular snaffle bit along with a straight check bit suits him because he drives perfectly straight.
- 3. He does not need trotting hopples. He's a good gaited horse and very well balanced.
- 4. He's never worn shin or knee boots. He trots very clean and reaches out well.
- 5. Scalpers are worn just as a precaution in case he goes sideways or has to make a sudden turn.
- 6. B Strike Three wears half-inch wide shoes up front with a little borium and a full swedge behind.
- 7. We recently added a line pole on the inside. He has started to bear in on the turns so we made this adjustment.
- 8. The Advantage bike best suits this horse. It tracks very well and Rick Zeron is comfortable using it.

Trainer Raz MacKenzie's comments:

"B Strike Three came to me at the beginning of his twoyear-old campaign from a long time friend of mine, Bret. Shultz. The colt has done everything right so far in his young career and we couldn't be more happy with him. I wish I had a barn full of horses like B Strike Three; I certainly wouldn't mind going to work in the morning.

"He's not an overly big horse, but he's much longer than he is tall. We wish he would have grown a little more between ages two and three but that wasn't the case. His attitude is very good and he's a pleasure to work with. When he gets to the track he's all business.

"Future plans for him include the OSS, Canadian Trotting Classic as well as the Super Final and his last start will likely be the Breeders Crown."
